





#### From The Presbytery To The Parish

The Advent banner in the church urges us to "Prepare". Each year as we enter Advent I find myself not only preparing for the miracle of Christmas, but automatically reviewing the year that has past; looking for signs as to where we are as a Parish, where we are as individuals and, most importantly, where I am as a Parish Priest.



My message last year centred on how all the elements of our community were working towards Parish goals through co-operation and procedures.

When I review the last twelve months, I believe it can be best described as a period of consolidation. That does not mean that there were no improvements nor hiccups along the way. Again, on behalf of Fr Joel and myself, thank you for your continued prayers and support. It is wonderful to be a Pastor to this Parish and we both look forward to serving you through 2018. May God bless and protect you, my dear friends, as you continue to show your faith by your actions.

#### Fr Joe

It is my sad task to have to tell you that Sr. Gen died at the Alfred Hospital in the early hours of Wednesday morning. As you know Gen had a serious car accident about five and a half weeks ago and did not recover from her injuries.

Gen was a dearly loved and treasured member of the Sisters of Mercy for over sixty three years and her death will leave a very big hole. During those years Gen was involved in Primary Education, Special Ed. Childcare, Aged Care, and Parish Pastoral work here, at St. Mac's.



Gen's heart was always centred in God and whatever she did she did it wholeheartedly. Gen loved people and she loved the people here at St. Mac's and beyond.

Gen was gifted with a keen intellect, a wonderful memory, a quick wit, a sense of humour and a beautiful warmth. She was fun-loving and great company and it was never difficult to touch Gen's heart. She was also a great storyteller and I loved to listen to the stories she shared with me from the treasury of her memory.

She used to say to me, "Don't think you'll be resting in heaven, you'll be busy working." I would like to acknowledge that each of you whose lives were touched by Gen will have your own grief and I pray that her goodness will live on in the way we care for one another. May God bless and keep you.
