



VOLUNTARY ASSISTED DYING BILL 2017 - A Pastoral Letter to the Catholics of Victoria

The Victorian Government has now introduced a bill into parliament about "assisted dying". The Archdiocese of Melbourne is asking the Catholics of Victoria to make their voices heard. Our democracy works best when its citizens speak up. Archbishop Denis Hart has released a pastoral letter about this. Copies are available from both porches or from the parish office. We encourage you all to take a copy and read it. Above all, we ask for your prayers to guide our politicians. If you have any queries, please contact Parish Office.

SIGN OF PEACE AT MASS "As for the actual sign of peace to be given, the manner is to be established by the conferences of bishops in accordance with the culture and customs of the peoples. However, it is appropriate that each person, in a sober manner, offer the sign of peace only to those who are nearest" (GIRM 82).

The Australian culture accepts shaking hands is appropriate. However, if someone is not shaking hands during the sign of peace, it is not necessarily a display of rudeness. It may be because the person is not well and wants to ensure that they do not spread any infection.
