

As we have the same spirit of faith that is mentioned in scripture – I believed, therefore I spoke we too believe and therefore we too speak, knowing that he who raised the Lord Jesus to life will raise us with Jesus in our turn, and put us by his side and you with us. You see, all this is for your benefit, so that the more grace is multiplied among people, the more thanksgiving there will be, to the glory of God. That is why there is no weakening on our part, and instead, though this outer man of ours may be falling into decay, the inner man is renewed day by day. Gospel Mk 3:20-35 A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

Jesus went home with his disciples, and such a crowd collected that they could not even have a meal. When his relatives heard of this, they set out to take charge of him, convinced he was out of his mind. The scribes who had come down from Jerusalem were saying, 'Beelzebul is in him,' and, 'It is through the prince of devils that he casts devils out.' So he called them to him and spoke to them in parables, 'How can Satan cast out Satan? If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot last. And if a household is divided against itself, that household can never stand. Now if Satan has rebelled against himself and is divided, he cannot stand either - it is the end of him. But no one can make his way into a strong man's house and burgle his property unless he has tied up the strong man first. Only then can he burgle his house. 'I tell you solemnly, all men's sins will be forgiven, and all their blasphemies; but let anyone blaspheme against the Holy Spirit and he will never have forgiveness: he is guilty of an eternal sin.' This was because they were saying, 'An unclean spirit is in him.' His mother and brothers now arrived and, standing outside, sent in a message asking for him. A crowd was sitting round him at the time the message was passed to him, 'Your mother and brothers and sisters are outside asking for you.' He replied, 'Who are my mother and my brothers?' And looking round at those sitting in a circle about him, he said, 'Here are my mother and my brothers. Anyone who does the will of God, that person is my brother and sister and mother.' 

The other teams will have a bye in rounds 12 to 14. At the half mark, except for two clubs, the top ten tippers are Adam L, 75, Marie O'Halloran, Debbie McMahon, Chris Smyth, and Geoffrey Walsh (all 72), Mike Barden, Tessa Houlihan (both 71), Trish Wallace, 70, Kees Duyvestyn, Paul Stinnear and Tony McInerney (all 69). There is a close battle between Granny Pie and Granny Finn. Only 1 point separates them but, not surprising, as they think very much the same!!! In round 11 most tippers were very happy by the end of Saturday games except Bulldog and Essendon supporters. At least in round 12 Bulldogs will have a bye instead of a loss as will Hawthorn, Carlton and WCE. St Kilda supporters only wish the Saints could be as accurate as they were in last term against WCE where they nearly defeated the leaders. HISTORY: Moving ten years on from 1897 to 1907 we find the top form teams to play in the finals were Carlton, South Melbourne (1st time in Finals), St Kilda and Collingwood. Carlton's second successive Premiership . (if only it was the same in 2018!) Hughie, Callan South's best player lost his life in World War 1. The umpire was Lardie Tulloch who had previously captained Collingwood to two premierships . Forty six thousand watched the Grand Final accurate as they were in last term against WCE where they nearly defeated the leaders.
