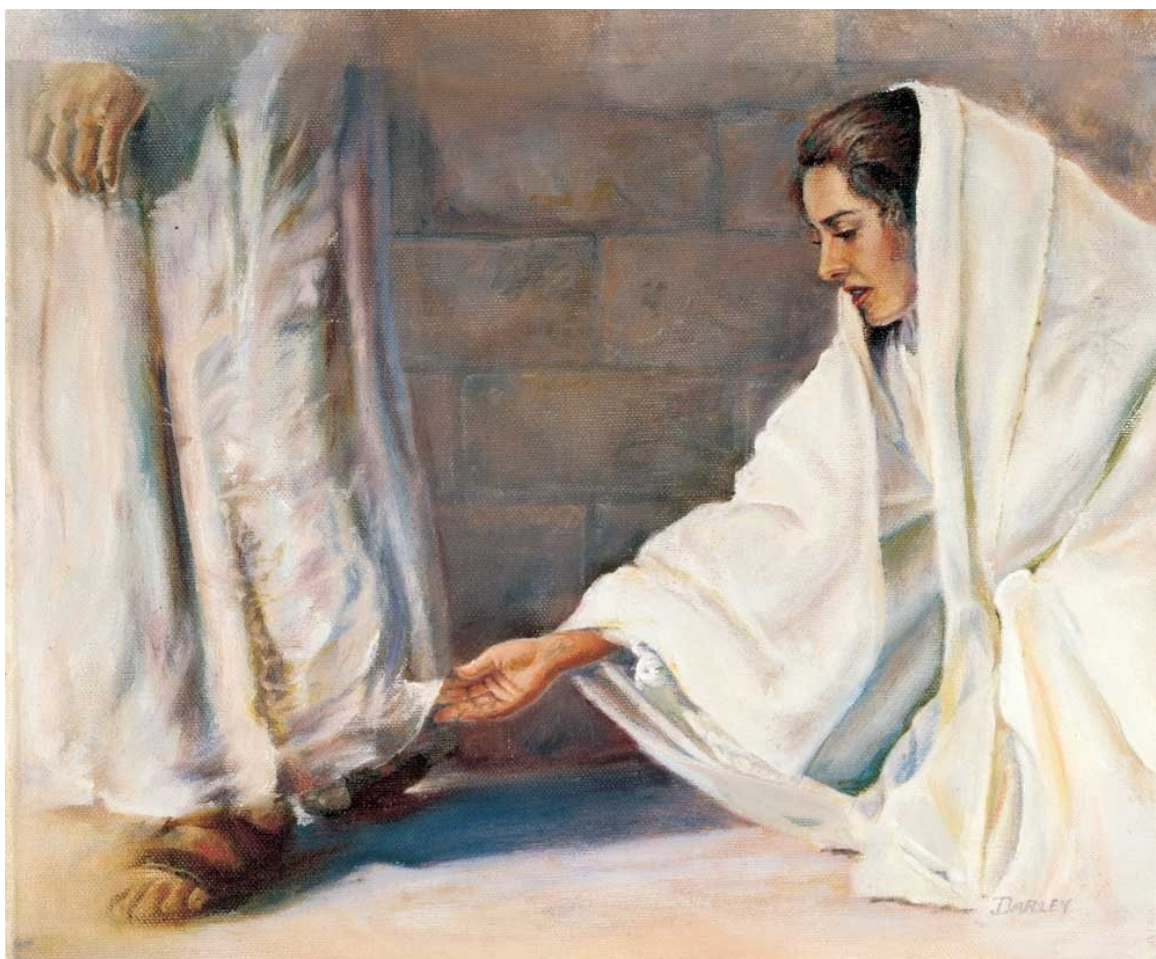

First Reading Wis 1:13-15; 2:23-24 A reading from the book of Wisdom

Death was not God's doing, he takes no pleasure in the extinction of the living. To be – for this he created all; the world's created things have health in them, in them no fatal poison can be found, and Hades holds no power on earth; for virtue is undying. Second Reading 2 Cor 8:7. 9. 13-15 A reading from the 2nd letter of St Paul to the Corinthians

You always have the most of everything – of faith, of eloquence, of understanding, of keenness for any cause, and the biggest share of our affection – so we expect you to put the most into this work of mercy too. Remember how generous the Lord Jesus was: he was rich, but he became poor for your sake, to make you rich out of his poverty. This does not mean that to give relief to others you ought to make things difficult for yourselves: it is a question of balancing what happens to be your surplus now against their present need, and one day they may have something to spare that will supply your own need. That is how we strike a balance: as scripture says: The man who gathered much had none too much, the man who gathered little did not go short.

Gospel Acclamation

Alleluia, alleluia! Our Saviour Jesus Christ has done away with death and brought us life through his gospel. Alleluia!

Gospel Mk 5:21-43 A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

When Jesus had crossed in the boat to the other side, a large crowd gathered round him and he stayed by the lakeside. Then one of the synagogue officials came up, Jairus by name, and seeing him, fell at his feet and pleaded with him earnestly, saying, 'My little daughter is desperately sick. Do come and lay your hands on her to make her better and save her life.' Jesus went with

him and a large crowd followed him; they were pressing all round him. Now there was a woman who had suffered from a haemorrhage for twelve years; after long and painful treatment under various doctors, she had spent all she had without being any the better for it, in fact, she was getting worse. She had heard about Jesus, and she came up behind him through the crowd and touched his cloak. 'If I can touch even his clothes,' she had told herself 'I will be well again.' And the source of the bleeding dried up instantly, and she felt in herself that she was cured of her complaint. Immediately aware that power had gone out from him, Jesus turned round in the crowd and said, 'Who touched my clothes?' His disciples said to him, 'You see how the crowd is pressing round you and yet you say, "Who touched me?"' But he continued to look all round to see who had done it. Then the woman came forward, frightened and trembling because she knew what had happened to her, and she fell at his feet and told him the whole truth. 'My daughter,' he said 'your faith has restored you to health; go in peace and be free from your complaint.' While he was still speaking some people arrived from the house of the synagogue official to say, 'Your daughter is dead: why put the Master to any further trouble?' But Jesus had overheard this remark of theirs and he said to the official, 'Do not be afraid; only have faith.' And he allowed no one to go with him except Peter and James and John the brother of James. So they came to the official's house and Jesus noticed all the commotion, with people weeping and wailing unrestrainedly. He went in and said to them, 'Why all this commotion and crying? The child is not dead, but asleep.' But they laughed at him. So he turned them all out and, taking with him the child's father and mother and his own companions, he went into the place where the child lay. And taking the child by the hand he said to her, 'Talitha, kum!' which means, 'little girl, I tell you to get up.' The little girl got up at once and began to walk about, for she was twelve years old. At this they were overcome with astonishment, and he ordered them strictly not to let anyone know about it, and told them to give her something to eat.

PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL - NEW FORMATION

The parish is currently conducting a review of its structure and operations. The first outcome of that review is that the Parish Pastoral Council will take on a new form and will consist of representatives from all the different groups within the parish.

The purpose of this new formation is to encourage communication and participation across all groups, ensuring everyone is informed of parish activities and direction on a day to day basis. Further changes will be announced in due course.

There is, however, a need for a small core group to consolidate information and discern direction and long-term planning for the parish.

It is proposed that the core group will consist of 6 - 8 members and will be created from some members of the old PPC and new nominations from the larger PPC group.

The role of the core group is to work closely with the PPC and advise and assist the Parish Priest in planning and promoting various parish activities and growth areas.

A NOTE TO ALL THANKSGIVING ENVELOPE USERS... In the past, we have made mention of the availability of direct debit from your bank account or credit card facilities which are available in the Parish for Thanksgiving payments, and are hoping that you might consider changing over to this method of contribution to help reduce parish costs. We would like to draw your attention to the cost of using envelopes in the Parish. The annual cost of maintaining the envelopes is approximately \$3,500.00, which includes the cost of the envelopes, postage for those not collected from the foyer and work hours to run the administration of the envelope system. This is a consistent cost each year to only process the envelope contributions, and these costs need to be paid from the funds donated by generous Parishioners BEFORE the funds can be put to good use within the Parish. If it is at all possible, would you please consider changing to the direct debit or credit card system? Your details are, of course, kept private and secure. This would save the Parish money and enable your generous Thanksgiving offering to be put to better use. PARISH EDUCATION BOARD

A new P.E.B. will be formed with the right proportion of parish and parent representation and will be constructed in conjunction with St Macartan's new principal and a representative of the Catholic Education Melbourne (C.E.M.). The C.E.M. will come to assist with the construction of the constitution for the board which has never existed.
