

At the request of the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference, I draw your attention to the fact that the Senate has decided to debate the Restoring Territory Rights (Assisted Suicide Legislation) Bill 2015 on 14, 15 and 16 August 2018, to allow territories the right to make laws on euthanasia.

If the bill passes, it will effectively mean euthanasia will be legalised in the ACT and perhaps also in the Northern Territory. Write to senators to oppose euthanasia. The Senate will soon vote on a Bill which would allow territories to legalise euthanasia and assisted suicide.
