

For more than 10 years a number of parishoners have trusted me with their small coins in an informal collection to provide medicines for Maria Auxiliadora Clinic, in Venilale, Timor 'Este. Every year we have sent at lest \$1,000, often more. This means a great deal to a clinic which treats around 10,000 every year & which relies entirely on donations. This wonderful work is continuing but there is one small administrative change. As most of you will know, my health is a challenge at present, so I have to cut back a bit. Thankfully, Lisa Cheizey, has agreed to keep this collection running just as it was - completely informal, no list of donors, no targets. You can give Lisa your tins & bags personally, you can mark them for Timor L'Este & hand them to the parish secretary, similarly marked you can put them in a parish Sunday collection. Those who choose to place their container on the organ when I'm playing are assured I'll pass it on. What do YOU do with your 5 cent & 10 cent coins? We know they buy nothing. 

Listen to what the Spirit is saying -"Listening and Dialogue"

What do you think God is asking of you at this time?

What do you think God is asking of us at St Macartan's, Mornington Parish at this time?

What do you think God is asking of us in Australia at this time?

**REFLECT:** In silence, reflect on your personal experience of faith up to this point in your life. Faith journey is about one's own experience of the Holy Spirit guiding and nurturing one's life in the community or one's life and (or in) the Church. How has the Gospel, the Church's teaching, ministry in which you are involved, influenced your faith? (You might want to choose a gospel passage to pray with). You may want to write your thoughts down.

<u>SHARE AND LISTEN:</u> Tell a story of my experience in this area. Take turns to share aloud with each other your personal experience of faith, life and the Church. When others are speaking, remember to listen with an open and humble heart.

**RECOLLECTING:** How has another perspective influenced my own? After each person has shared, in silence, reflect on how stories shared by other people have influenced your own perspective. You may want to write your thoughts down, or simply sit quietly with your thoughts. **SHARING:** I would like to encourage group and public sharing, which means, you can represent your group to share at mass, or you can share your own faith journey at Mass. I am open to suggestions.
