THINK ABOUT IT - AUSTRALIA'S OVERSEAS AID

Australia's Overseas Aid is our commitment to countries in need. Australia helps many countries, mainly in South–East Asia and the South Pacific. Overseas Aid was not mentioned in the treasurer's budget speech is not high in this government's priorities. It was, however, included in the budget papers where it was increased minimally and then, incredibly, reduced by almost double the same amount! The result being our government's contribution is even more miserly than before.

Why is Overseas Aid important. First, it's a matter of simple justice. Second, because in 1971 Australia agreed with 30 other wealthy countries to aim towards 0.7% of our Gross National Income being allocated to it. Third, because the great majority of Australians value fairness and believe we should share our wealth. Only 6 countries have reached the target of 0.7%. Australia lags in the lower half on 0.21% Today you will be offered a flyer which explains where Australia stands on Overseas Aid.

Please take it and consider it carefully as a possible factor in the coming election. Australia is a wealthy country. Many of our neighbours in the Pacific and South-East Asia are desperately poor. As Cardinal Bo of Myanmar said recently "Poverty is the mortal sin of our times".

Poverty is man-made; is can be overcome. Individually we can contribute only a limited amount; our government has the resources to make a substantial difference to those is need. We must persuade them to do so. *Social Justice Group*

<u>REFLECT</u>: In silence, reflect on your personal experience of faith up to this point in your life. Faith journey is about one's own experience of the Holy Spirit guiding and nurturing one's life in the community or one's life and (or in) the Church. How has the Gospel, the Church's teaching, ministry in which you are involved, influenced your faith? (You might want to choose a gospel passage to pray with). You may want to write your thoughts down.

<u>SHARE AND LISTEN</u>: Tell a story of my experience in this area. Take turns to share aloud with each other your personal experience of faith, life and the Church. When others are speaking, remember to listen with an open and humble heart.

<u>RECOLLECTING</u>: How has another perspective influenced my own? After each person has shared, in silence, reflect on how stories shared by other people have influenced your own perspective. You may want to write your thoughts down, or simply sit quietly with your thoughts. **<u>SHARING</u>**: I would like to encourage group and public sharing, which means, you can

represent your group to share at mass, or you can share your own faith journey at Mass.
