

First Reading: A reading from the Acts of the Apostles; Acts 2:1-11 When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech. Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome – Jews and proselytes alike – Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.' In the one Spirit we were all baptised, Jews as well as Greeks, slaves as well as citizens, and one Spirit was given to us all to drink.

Congratulations to Jenny Raccanello and William Craske who make their vows on Saturday 8th June. We wish them happiness in the years ahead as husband and wife.





Listen to what the Spirit is saying -"Listening and Dialogue"

What do you think God is asking of you at this time?

What do you think God is asking of us at St Macartan's, Mornington Parish at this time?

What do you think God is asking of us in Australia at this time?

REFLECT: In silence, reflect on your personal experience of faith up to this point in your life. Faith journey is about one's own experience of the Holy Spirit guiding and nurturing one's life in the community or one's life and (or in) the Church. How has the Gospel, the Church's teaching, ministry in which you are involved, influenced your faith? (You might want to choose a gospel passage to pray with). You may want to write your thoughts down.

<u>SHARE AND LISTEN:</u> Tell a story of my experience in this area. Take turns to share aloud with each other your personal experience of faith, life and the Church. When others are speaking, remember to listen with an open and humble heart.

<u>RECOLLECTING:</u> How has another perspective influenced my own? After each person has shared, in silence, reflect on how stories shared by other people have influenced your own perspective. You may want to write your thoughts down, or simply sit quietly with your thoughts.

SHARING: I would like to encourage group and public sharing, which means, you can represent your group to share at mass, or you can share your own faith journey at Mass. I am open to suggestions.

Plenary Council 2020 Update

Are we praying, thinking, talking about our hopes for the coming plenary council?

Recently a group of five parish priests and their parish lay leaders met to discuss the coming plenary council. Other parishes were invited but our social justice group members could not make it and, as far as we know, St Macartan's was not represented. However, we have approval to publish their findings.

The complete statement is on the social justice noticeboards. In today's bulletin, we begin a series of extracts. Please consider these prayerfully. Do we want to write in support of them?

"This statement is made by a group of parishoners in Melbourne. We are deeply concerned about past Trends while also hopeful that real change can be achieved before and at Plenary Council 2020. We want to see the following changes made.

1. Address the Sexual Abuse Crisis

All Catholic institutions with possible historical sexual abuse complaints should immediately join the redress system. A trauma-informed treatment approach with support that is both competent and adequate is needed to assist the survivors. The Church must provide an ongoing ministry of support to victims/survivors of clerical child sexual abuse.

2. Change the Nature of the Plenary Council

If the council is not seen as genuinely representative of the Church, it will fail. A majority of the delegates to the Council should be lay people and priests working in parishes, with at least half of these women. Voting must be open and transparent, with the "sense of the faithful" revealed by processes involving all those attending."

Their further resolutions will be published in following weeks.
