

My brothers, you were called, as you know, to liberty; but be careful, or this liberty will provide an opening for self-indulgence. Serve one another, rather, in works of love, since the whole of the Law is summarised in a single command: Love your neighbour as yourself. If you go snapping at each other and tearing each other to pieces, you had better watch or you will destroy the whole community.

Let me put it like this: if you are guided by the Spirit you will be in no danger of yielding to self-indulgence, since self-indulgence is the opposite of the Spirit, the Spirit is totally against such a thing, and it is precisely because the two are so opposed that you do not always carry out your good intentions. If you are led by the Spirit, no law can touch you.




PIETY STALL New Stock has arrived: Olive Wood Comfort Crosses

<u>Pray for Archbishop Peter</u> This weekend (Saturday 29 June) Archbishop Peter received the blessed Pallium from Pope Francis. The Pallium is a small woollen vestment (like a scarf) which is worn over Mass vestments to signify his role as the Metropolitan Archbishop of Melbourne. The Pope blesses the Pallium for each new Metropolitan Archbishop each year on the Feast of Ss Peter and Paul, and the Archbishops who receive it come back to their cities where the Apostolic Nuncio (Papal Ambassador) will formally impose the Pallium as a sign of his unity with the Pope and the Universal Church. Let us pray that this moment for Archbishop Peter as our chief shepherd in Melbourne; for all of our priests, deacons and seminarians, and for many more vocations to priesthood, diaconate and consecrated life.

Here are the next two recommendations the group of Melbourne parishes has presented for consideration by the plenary council.

7 Make the Liturgy More Relevant

The Council should move to make the liturgy more relevant for a truly synodal church, e.g by reforming the language used, reinstating the Third Rite of Reconciliation and removing the moral restrictions on attending sacraments. As Pope Francis has said, the Eucharist is not a prize for the perfect but nourishment for the weak.

8 Renew our Focus on the Poor and Marginalised

The Council should set out to revitalise and extend the important work for the poor and marginalised that the Australian Church has done over the past 150 years. We need to build on past achievements to increase our outward-facing focus, reaching out to our first nation people, asylum seekers, the vulnerable and the disadvantaged
