#### Gospel Jn 3:16-18

#### A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

Jesus said to Nicodemus

'God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son, so that everyone that believes in him may not be lost but may have eternal life.

For God sent his Son into the world not to condemn the world, but so that through him the world might be saved.

No one who believes in him will be condemned; but whoever refuses to believe is condemned already, because he has refused to believe in the name of God's only Son.

#### Communion Antiphon Gal 4:6

Since you are children of God, God has sent into your hearts the Spirit of his Son, the Spirit who cries out: Abba, Father.



Every time we bless ourselves or begin prayer with the sign of the cross, we reaffirm our belief in the Trinity. That seemingly simple prayer, 'In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit,' is, in fact, a confirmation of our belief in a triune God – three in one. The earliest use of the sign of the cross only involved tracing a small cross with the thumb or finger on the forehead as it is still done in baptisms or blessings today. Later, describing the shape of the cross on forehead, abdomen and shoulders became the common practice.



## We believe...

The teaching on the Trinity was not formally constructed until the 4th Century and was documented in the creed that emerged from the Council of Nicaea. The Creed that is said today in the Sunday liturgy is a version of that original Nicene Creed. The Nicene Creed spells out Christian beliefs about the nature of God, Jesus and the Spirit and was worded very carefully to negate a variety of heretical views that were held at the time. It is as much a statement about what we do not believe as it is a statement about what we do believe!

#### **EXPLORING THE WORD**

Nicodemus, a member of the ruling elite of the Jewish people, wants to believe in Jesus but is afraid to do so publicly, so he comes to Jesus at night (John 3:2). Darkness and night are often used in John as symbols of an inability to accept the truth of who Jesus is, but still Nicodemus is drawn. He is open to the truth but fears the consequences. One of those consequences is that belief in Jesus as Son of the Father leads to life, while rejecting that truth leads to condemnation. In John, 'the world' is used as a symbol of unbelief or darkness, but Jesus tells Nicodemus that the world is not to be condemned because the light has come into the world. It is now up to individuals to recognise that light and come to belief. Only thus can the world be

saved. Jesus is also showing the relationship he has with the Father - that of the only Son.

- Do you empathise with Nicodemus at all? Is there a niggling fear or uncertainty about coming to believe in Jesus and learning more about him?
- Reflect on times when you have found light in the darkness.
- In what ways does Jesus give you a glimpse of God?

#### **DID YOU KNOW?**

- From earliest times, the church has pondered the relationship between the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The doctrine of the Trinity most eloquently defined at the Council of Chalcedon (ad 451) as three persons in one God is the result of this.
- Theologians today continue to contemplate the mystery of the Trinity.
- The Catechism of the Catholic Church tells us that 'The mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of the Christian faith and of Christian life. God alone can make it known to us by revealing himself as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit' (§261).
- St Patrick is reputed to have attempted to explain the mystery of the Trinity as God who is Three-in-one by using the shamrock as a symbol. Another commonly used symbol of the Trinity is the triangle.
- The Trinity is sometimes described as the Lover (Father), the Beloved (Son) and the Love between (Spirit).
- Our God is relational. Humans, created in the image and likeness of God, are created to be in relationship with others.

## COVID-19 restrictions - What is next for us at St Macartan's? UPDATE FOR THE WEEK OF 8th June

Hello everyone,

We will be opening the Church again for Masses - Yippee!!!!!



From <u>Tuesday the 23rd</u> June, **ALL Masses** will be back on, as I expect 50 people will be allowed in the Church - Please, Daniel Andrews.



This week we are still only allowed 20 people in Mass - **ONLY Saturday and Wednesday Masses** are available via booking, by calling the Office. These Masses also have reconciliation available afterwards. (All other weekday Masses NOT YET! From 23rd June).

The Church is also open during the day for private prayer. But ALL MUST sign in and hand sanitize, with <u>no more than 20 people allowed in the Church at one time</u>. Please restrict your visit to less that 20 minutes to allow others to worship.

And you may be checked on by the Police? Remember they can issue on the spot fines of **up to \$1,652** for individuals and **up to \$9,913** for businesses.

## WE NEED VOLUNTEERS! (Weekends & Weekdays)

- Volunteer Mass door counters/ushers (Please contact 0419427408)
- Volunteer Church sanitation/cleaners after Mass (Please contact 0419427408)
   If you are one of the volunteers, you will be on a roster and when rostered on, you are guaranteed of being able to attend Mass.

#### ALLOWED TO RESTART IMMEDIATELY:

- All prayer/worship groups. BUT currently only 20 people.
- Men's breakfast (restart date to be announced). Again only 20 people.

#### Room Size restrictions; with the **4 square metre** social distancing rule:

- Community Centre (Main Room) = 13 people
- Community Centre (High Spirits area) = 4 people
- Community Centre (Marian Chapel/Room) = 4 people
- Community Centre (Gatherings Office) = 3 people
- Hall = 24-29 people, depending on set-up? BUT currently only 20 people.
- Counting Room = 6 people
- SVDP room = 7 people
- Church = 100 people with only 3 per pew. BUT currently only 20 people.

In each room - All people to be seated at least 1.5m apart.

#### **SCHOOL NEWS**

St Macartan's Primary School

What's happening re: COVID-19 at our School?

The return to school will take place in two stages.

This will give the Victorian Chief Health Officer and Government time to monitor and evaluate the effects that the staged return to school has on the increased movement of people and transmission within the community.

Schools will begin a staged return from remote and distance learning as follows:

**Stage 1 Monday 25 May 2020** - Pupil free day to enable the planning necessary to ensure the successful transition back to school can be completed. Tuesday 26 May 2020 – Prep, Year 1 and 2 children return to school. Remote and distance learning will continue for the students in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6. During Stage 1, the existing model of onsite schooling for students who cannot be supervised at home and vulnerable children will remain in place.

**Stage 2 Tuesday 9 June 2020** – Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 return to school. All students will attend school as normal from Tuesday 9 June 2020.

School will "look different" from what students, parents and staff were used to. St Macartan's is focused on the very important role in both protecting the health of our students and staff, and in supporting broader efforts to slow the spread of COVID-19.

I really want to express my gratitude to Principal Colleen McGreal and her leadership team, who have been magnificent in leading the school through this Covid-19 crisis.

Also to you parents; your support and encouragement has, I know, meant a lot to them. I have been very impressed with the schools efforts to always seek out the best ways to continue teaching your children, even though, it sometimes meant extra pressure and work done behind the scenes by many teachers.

Importantly too, were their decisions and courses of actions that were based on best health advice, to protect your children.







#### THE MOST HOLY TRINITY





## SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY TRINITY DEVOTIONAL

Gospel: (Matthew 28: 16-20)

The eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had ordered them. When they all saw him, they worshiped, but they doubted. Then Jesus approached and said to them, "All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age."

#### Reflection:

The Holy Trinity is an archetypal example of a Family – The relationship is as One Love, equal in Love in each and for all. All families should be urged to imitate the Trinity, and to live a life in which all are one, as Jesus is one with the Father and the Spirit. Jesus wanted his followers to have in themselves the image of the Trinity, to share a sacred relation to the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. A Family should want to be together as having but one heart and soul so that through this union of spirit we would be a true image of the unity of God.

We, as a Church congregation should see ourselves as a Family and to celebrate as a Family, in a celebration of mutual love and friendship out of a passion to serve the Lord. Unlike organizations that meet to conduct business, the Church is there to celebrate and deepen its unity between us and our Trinitarian God. It is in the Church, meeting as a Family, that enables all its members to experience Christ's presence in themselves and equally in each other and the workings of the Holy Spirit. In a sense, these gatherings become a living, vivid witness of God's healing presence among us and the living example of the Holy Trinity.

#### To meditate on:

How can we, as a Church, better model the unity of the Trinity "being of one mind and one heart"?

#### **Closing Prayer:**


O Holy Trinity, truly you are a God of Unity,
