First Reading

Acts 2:1-11

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak different languages.

When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech.

Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome – Jews and proselytes alike – Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'

Rom 8:8-17

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans

People who are interested only in unspiritual things can never be pleasing to God.

Your interests, however, are not in the unspiritual, but in the spiritual, since the Spirit of God has made his home in you. In fact, unless you possessed the Spirit of Christ you would not belong to him. Though your body may be dead it is because of sin, but if Christ is in you then your spirit is life itself because you have been justified; and if the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead is living in you, then he who raised Jesus from the dead will give life to your own mortal bodies through his Spirit living in you.

So then, my brothers, there is no necessity for us to obey our unspiritual selves or to live unspiritual lives. If you do live in that way, you are doomed to die; but if by the Spirit you put an end to the misdeeds of the body you will live.

Everyone moved by the Spirit is a son of God. The spirit you received is not the spirit of slaves bringing fear into your lives again; it is the spirit of sons, and it makes us cry out, 'Abba, Father!' The Spirit himself and our spirit bear united witness that we are children of God. And if we are children we are heirs as well: heirs of God and coheirs with Christ, sharing his sufferings so as to share his glory.

LIVING THE GOSPEL

Come, Holy Spirit

'Come, Holy Spirit', or its Latin, Vene Sancte Spiritus, has become the basis of countless prayers and hymns over many hundreds of years. To this day, it remains a powerful invocation that can be used in prayer or meditation. Three simple words convey a wealth of meaning. The invitation for the Spirit to 'Come' indicates recognition of the need for the Spirit's intervention and openness to accept the guidance that the Spirit brings. It is a powerful, simple prayer that can be used at the outset of any significant undertaking or whenever you find yourself in need of inspiration.

EXPLORING THE WORD

The Christian imperative to love as Jesus loved is again at the centre of the gospel. To love God and therefore to love the Son can be shown by keeping the commandments that Jesus gave—that is to say, by living life as a Christian should. To help in this task, Jesus promises to send the Advocate, the one who will teach and constantly remind the followers of Jesus of all that has been said to them.

- What are the demands of living as Christ has taught us? The first reading of the Pentecost Mass tells the story of the events on that fateful day in Jerusalem.

- Read the text from the Acts of the Apostles together. One of the things that is emphasised

is that when 'they were filled' with the gift of the Holy Spirit, the disciples were able to overcome barriers and divisions and to 'preach about the marvels of God' to people from all parts of the world.

- In what ways does the Spirit continue to enable the disciples of Jesus to do just that, even in our own time?
- Invite those present to reflect on their own baptism, when they too received the Holy Spirit. What does this mean for them now?

MAKING CONNECTIONS

- 'If you love me you will keep my commandments.' What are the commandments that Jesus gave? How easy or difficult is it for you to keep them and live them?
- 'The Advocate ... will teach you everything and remind you of all that I said to you.' How open are you to seeing the action of the Holy Spirit in the world around you?
- Recall someone you no longer see but who had a significant influence on shaping who you are; someone whose memory is alive for you and whose influence remains strong. Share your recollections of this person. Does this phenomenon give insight into the experience of the disciples at Pentecost?
- Spend some time this week thinking about the gifts of the Spirit that you can discern in yourself. Try to recognise and affirm the gifts of others this week, and use one of your own gifts to make life a little easier for someone else.

DID YOU KNOW?

- Pentecost was originally a Jewish harvest festival, celebrated fifty days after the Passover. It was one of the great pilgrimage festivals of the Jews, and this is why so many pilgrims were present in Jerusalem on the day when the Spirit was manifested in the lives of the disciples.
- The Christian feast of Pentecost is fifty days after Easter and is the culmination of the Lent–Easter–Pentecost cycle.
- The Church teaches that the Holy Spirit brings both gifts and fruits to the faithful (see Sharing the Tradition).
- Pentecost Sunday was often known as Whit Sunday or Whitsun, especially in England.

SHARING THE TRADITION

Coming to faith is not so much acquiring a new set of beliefs about God as it is discovering God's existence within the realities of our daily lives. The gifts and fruits of the Holy Spirit help us to be more attuned to the actions of God in our lives and in our world. At baptism, the Spirit comes upon the newly initiated Christian, and at confirmation, the Spirit of God is renewed and confirmed in the faithful. The seven gifts of the Holy Spirit are: wisdom, understanding, counsel (right judgment), fortitude (courage), knowledge, piety (reverence) and fear (awe) of the Lord (CCC, §1831). The Church lists twelve fruits of the Spirit: charity (love), joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, generosity, gentleness, faithfulness, modesty, self-control and chastity (CCC, §1832).

- Explore these gifts and fruits of the Holy Spirit. How do you see them manifested in yourself and others? In what ways do we need to cultivate these gifts and fruits? How are you called to use these gifts and fruits?

SYMBOLS AND IMAGES

Red is the colour that is often associated with the Spirit, and red vestments are worn by the priest on Pentecost Sunday. Red symbolises the intense love or 'fire' of the Holy Spirit. Other symbols of the Spirit are tongues of flame, wind and a white dove. All have their origins in Scripture. Each of these conveys something of the mystery of the Spirit of God, which is beyond human understanding.

Pope: Ukrainian grain must not be used as a weapon of war!

Pope Francis expresses great concern over warnings of grain shortages worldwide due to the war in Ukraine, and appeals for "every effort to be made" to "guarantee the universal right to food." By Deborah Castellano Lubov

Pope Francis has appealed for an end to the blockade of grain exports from Ukraine.

At the conclusion of his weekly General Audience, the Holy Father again turned to the ongoing war in Ukraine. "Of great concern," the Pope said, "is the blockade of grain exports from Ukraine, on which the lives of millions of people depend, especially in the poorest countries."

Every effort to guarantee universal right: *"I earnestly appeal for every effort to be made to resolve this issue and to guarantee the universal human right to food."*

"Please do not use wheat, a staple food, as a weapon of war!" he appealed. The Holy Father decried the likely grain, which has in part by Russia's Ukraine.

Global food crisis

ports. The price of grain, cooking oil, fertiliser, and energy have soared as the war continues, and as Western nations impose sanctions on Russia in response to its invasion of Ukraine. To help avert the crisis, Ukraine is trying to export its vast stores of grain by road, river and rail, but agricultural officials note it has no chance of hitting its targets unless Russia lifts its blockade of Ukraine's Black Sea ports. Ukraine and Russia together accounted for nearly 30 percent of the world's wheat exports in 2021, and wheat prices have risen by over 50 percent since the start of the year.

Pope's prayers for peace and to end wars

Pope Francis has made countless appeals for peace in the war-torn country, as well as for an end to the war in Ukraine and to wars around the world.

On Tuesday evening, closing the Marian month of May, Pope Francis prayed a Rosary for peace for these intentions in Rome's Marian Basilica of St. Mary Major.

On 25 March, Pope Francis consecrated all humanity, especially Russia and Ukraine, to the Immaculate Heart of Mary in St. Peter's Basilica, and said the act expressed our complete trust in the Virgin Mary in the midst of the "cruel and senseless war" in Ukraine.

Take the Way of the Gospel – Part 3

The formation of Missions provides us with a process to work together in becoming more missionary. It has three particular aims:

AIM #1: GREATER EFFECTIVENESS IN SHARING THE GOSPEL

Coming together as local faith communities enables greater collaboration and a stronger sense of shared mission. This then enables our local parish communities become alive with missionary disciples of Jesus Christ fully living their baptismal call.

AIM #2: VIBRANCY, VITALITY, VIABILITY

Vibrant communities are filled with passionate followers of Jesus Christ who share:

- vision to grow the Kingdom of God. They have a clear direction and purpose.
- mission where each person is seen as uniquely called and gifted to share the Gospel and is equipped and sent by the parish to live their call. Vibrant parishes have a growing number of members engaged in evangelisation, fellowship, worship, discipleship formation and outreach.

Vital communities understand:

- their surrounding neighbourhood and culture;
- that people are searching for a deeper spiritual connection in their lives where their hopes, joys and anxieties can be expressed; that what happened in the past may no longer fit into where the parish is being called today. They are hospitable to new people and new ideas that are different from what has always been done;
- that new possibilities for ministry and service will emerge and they can adapt to these new opportunities in ways that are flexible.

Viable communities have the resources, and are able to mobilise those resources, for their common vision and mission.

- They have sufficient income streams to fund and grow their mission;
- Their buildings support the needs of their mission and ministries rather than sapping their resources;
- They can serve their communities in a sustainable way and parishioner financial contributions are respected and used prudently.

AIM #3: EQUITABLE SHARING OF RESOURCES

The formation of Missions helps to ensure that spiritual, ministerial and material resources are more equitably distributed across the Archdiocese, based on current needs rather than the needs of generations past. This means recognising the changing needs in particular parish communities, caused by growth or decline in the numbers of people attending Mass as a result of demographic change. It also ensures that the skills, gifts and resources of all our parishioners (young and old) are both recognised and utilised to their fullest capacity, and provides for more sustainable ministry.

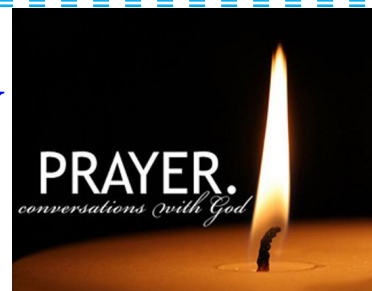

The Grand Final was won by Essendon who defeated hot favourites Richmond. Essendon won 19--18--132 to Richmond 11--13--79 in front of a crowd of 49,000. Captain Coach of Essendon, R. Reynolds was BOG. G. Lane kicked 6 goals for the Dons. Jack Dyer was Captain/Coach of the Tigers. When Essendon defeated South Melbourne in the Preliminary Final. it was the first time since 1925 they had won at the Princes Oval.
